There are over 46,200 children in Out-of-Home Care in Australia.¹

The number of children being removed from their families each year is increasing, while the number of Foster Carers is decreasing². Nationally, governments are struggling to recruit and retain carers.

The Church is called to serve the most vulnerable members of our communities. Let's celebrate and support the Foster and Kinship Carers who are living on mission, providing loving homes for children who are unable to live with their birth family. We can all do something to create communities of welcome and support for carers and children with an experience of the Out-of-Home Care system.

Foster Care Sunday 2024 is Sunday 8 September and we invite churches across Australia to host Foster Care Sunday on a day that works.

On Foster Care Sunday:

- Celebrate carers in your church or community with a handwritten card, coffee or meal voucher, flowers, morning tea after church, or another gesture of appreciation!

Other ways to Respond

These are some other ideas to respond in meaningful ways:

- Pray for more homes for children, for children growing up in care, for carers
- Host a movie night at your church and watch a movie about foster care
- Host a trauma awareness training session so you can learn more about how to support all members of your community
- Cook a meal for carers in your church or community
- Provide a freezer of meals and baked goods for carers in your community
- Host a date night for carers, supervising the kids while carers go out
- Explore mentoring options for a child or young person in care
- Host morning teas for carers in your community
- Offer free babysitting for carers (in line with any agency conditions based on the type of care placement)
- Learn more about the impacts of trauma so your church can be a safe place for all children and families

Why Foster Care Sunday?

"Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world." James 1:27

At the heart of Foster Care Sunday is to inspire and equip God's people to live the "pure religion" described in the book of James and expressed throughout Scripture. Our aim as shepherds and leaders is to help the people of God live in ways that are decisively different and set apart (holy) and embody selfgiving sacrifice (helpfulness) for the orphan, widow and vulnerable among us. It's the intricate and never mutually exclusive relationship between identity and action – allowing what we do to flow from who we are.

Our goal as the Church is not recruitment or activism first; it is discipleship. Ultimately, to see the people of God deeply celebrating the love of God for us through the work of Jesus (identity - who we are) and then widely demonstrating that love in our work on behalf of those around us (action what we do).

Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Proverbs 31:8

In any community, children without the protection of their parents are the most vulnerable. As Christians we are called to care for the vulnerable. We are also called to act as advocates, the Bible shows us that we are reflecting the character of Jesus and how he first loved us. Both Jesus and the Holy Spirit are referred to as our advocates – Jesus advocates



for us to the Father (Hebrews 7:25, Romans 8:24, 1 Timothy 2:5) and the Holy Spirit advocates for us when we don't know how to pray (Romans 8:26).

On Foster Care Sunday you have an opportunity to advocate for children growing up in care at your church. Speak about the need for more foster and kinship carers, the need for more Indigenous carers, the need to change outcomes for children leaving out of home care ...

Utilise this Sunday focus as a catalyst for further, ongoing, long-term engagement in the lives of vulnerable children and families. *Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord*

Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God.

Foster Care Sunday is just the start. We pray that each year as churches around Australia celebrate Foster Carer's Sunday more people will respond with action.

Foster Care Sunday is a national day to celebrate the role of Foster and Kinship Carers, raise awareness of children needing families, and to encourage local churches to play a role in being a safe and supportive space for those involved in the Out-of-Home Care system.

When is Foster Care Sunday?

Foster Care Sunday is celebrated on the second Sunday of September -10th September 2023.
